Gallery Hosts Sculptor Newcomer


On the First Friday in January, from 6 to 9 p.m., Gallery 152 will present young female sculptor, Brianne M. Dopirak, with her exhibit "Experience."

New to the area, Dopirak grew up in Pittsburgh. She received her bachelor's of fine arts degree in 2001 from the University of Pittsburgh.

Dopirak sees herself as shaped by social forces that over time have affected the lives of many Pennsylvanians and Americans.

"I grew up part of a middleclass family in Pittsburgh, during the dark period of the steel mill closings. My family, like so many others, was forced to have their lives turned upside down by the politics of business and the hardships of social class. I spent most of my youth trying to figure out how to bridge the emotions and curiosities I felt with a voice. The journey brought me to art," she said.

Dopirak wrote, "Life is an experience. I find it difficult not

to notice the details of even the most mundane objects. I walk past a gathering of trees and find it impossible not to touch at least one just to feel the texture of its skin. In my work, I take these personal experiences and connections and recreate them into a tangible or at least visible form. I concert my process of creation with every detail I experience, even if what you see before you turns out to be as simple as a straight line. I then magnify those details and recreate them with the most unexpected materials. 'Experience' is a collage of my work over the past seven years. It combines feminine issues with historical commentary. The exhibit, just like my work, challenges you and I to find the detail that forces the connection and creates the experience."

Already the recipient of several awards and honors, including the A.J. Schneider Award for Excellence in Studio Arts, Dopirak's work will be at Gallery 152 until the end of January.



Gifts of Art Hosts Artists On First Friday

Fiber artist Jeane Ryersbach is the Artist of the Month at the Gifts of Art Gallery, 123 W. Fourth St. Joining Ryersbach during the First Friday reception at 6 p.m. Friday is Leslie Umstead, an artist who specializes in mixed media.

Ryersbach, co-owner of Levinson's Formalwear, 366 Market St., South Williamsport, creates wearable art such as jackets, tops, dresses and slacks and caps, as well as creates wall hangings and sculptured fiber baskets.

Her line of wearable art is most often silk or African mudcloth. Her wall hangings and baskets, however, often take a life of their own after Ryersbach begins tying her "knots" interested primarily in texture and color.

Umstead is a Hughesville artist who creates items for art shows, one in State College and one at the Dover Air Force Base, where her handpainted home decor items and polymer clay art is in demand.

Umstead creates "funky" colorful clay fish. Her naturethemed clay artwork often is adhered to bowls, flower pots and ornaments. She also sculpted and hand-painted a miniature version of the Hughesville town clock, auctioned during that town's sesquicentennial.
